Crystal Ice Figure Skating Club Membership



The fees listed below do not include U.S. Figure Skating Membership fees which are required for all skaters. All memberships require good standing within a club. Memberships can be canceled or suspended for failure to pay dues, complete volunteer requirements, or violation of the code of conduct. These descriptions are subject to change at the discretion of the CIFSC Board of Directors. Members will be notified of any changes. Memberships run from July 1-June 30 and must be renewed annually. Skaters wishing to utilize summer ice in July and August must renew their membership by June 30. Membership enrollment will open late May and close the day before the August membership meeting. It will not reopen until the following May. Junior Club members who are 18 at the time of registration or will be 18 before the ice show of that membership year, must complete their SkateSafe training before membership is considered complete.

Junior Club Member

Skaters who are under the age of eighteen or are still enrolled in high school. The following rules apply to Junior Club Members:

- 1. They are eligible to test with USFSA, compete in all sanctioned competitions, and purchase CIFSC package ice
- 2. Volunteer requirements must be met
- 3. Eligible to participate in synchronized skating
- 4. Eligible to participate in the high school team (9th-12th grade)
- 5. Eligible to participate in the Ice Show
- 6. Eligible to try out for a specialty or solo Ice Show number (Free skate 3 and higher)
- 7. Eligible for all credit earning options (must have Junior Club status at the time of credit earning sign-up AND credit earning event)
- 8. Must skate at least one freestyle package during the season
- 9. Priority for ice package sign-up.
- 10. Required rink monitoring duties
- 11. Be SkateSafe compliant (if eighteen before the ice show of the membership year)
- 12. Eligible to vote
- 13. Adhere to the skater code of conduct
- 14. Annual fee: \$55

Synchronized Skating Member

Skaters who participate in group Learn to Skate Classes for Basic 1-6 and are not yet eligible for Junior Club membership. The following rules apply to Synchronized Skating Members:

- 1. They are unable to walk-on or purchase package ice through CIFSC
- 2. Eligible to participate in synchronized skating
- 3. Some credit earning options are available
- 4. Eligible to participate in the Ice Show
- 5. Once a skater reaches the Freestyle level, they are required to be a Junior Club Member the following season
- 6. Adhere to the skater code of conduct
- 7. Annual fee: \$25

Collegiate Member

Skaters who are currently enrolled in a post-secondary school and have their home membership with our club. The following rules apply to Collegiate Members:

- 1. They are eligible to test with USFSA and compete in all sanctioned competitions
- 2. Eligible for package and walk-on ice, when available
- 3. SkateSafe compliance is strongly encouraged
- 4. Adhere to the skater code of conduct
- 5. Fee: \$35 for 4 years

Associate Member

Skaters must have a full membership with another home club. The following rules apply to Associate Members:

- 1. They are eligible to test with USFSA and compete in all sanctioned competitions
- 2. Eligible for package and walk-on ice, when available
- 3. Eligible to participate in synchronized skating (under the age of eighteen and/or currently enrolled in high school)
- 4. SkateSafe compliance, if applicable, is strongly encouraged
- 5. Adhere to the skater code of conduct
- 6. Annual fee: \$45

Adult Member

Skaters who are over the age of eighteen and are not currently enrolled in high school. The following rules apply to Adult Members:

- 1. They are eligible to test with USFSA and compete in all sanctioned competitions
- 2. Eligible for package and walk-on ice, when available
- 3. SkateSafe compliance is strongly encouraged
- 4. Adhere to the skater code of conduct
- 5. Annual fee: \$55

Board Member

The following rules apply to Board Members:

- Complete required U.S. Figure Skating background check
- 2. Maintain SafeSkate Compliance
- 3. Adhere to the parent code of conduct, board member agreement, and uphold the CIFSC Bylaws

Coaches

Skaters who fulfill all U.S. Figure Skating coaching requirements. The following rules apply to Coaches:

- 1. Submit a Coach of Record Agreement to the CIFSC board annually
- 2. Maintain coach compliance through US Figure Skating.
- Non-home club members must email a screenshot of their US Figure Skating Coach Compliance card to <u>cifscstevenspoint@gmail.com</u> annually
- 4. Adhere to the coach's code of conduct

5. Eligible for package and walk-on ice, when available.

U.S. Figure Skating Membership

These fees are set by US Figure Skating and are subject to change at their discretion. All CIFSC members must also hold a US Figure Skating Membership. These fees are **in addition** to the CIFSC membership fees listed above.

There are four full membership categories:

Introductory

Available only through a member club, this full membership is open to first-time full members at a discounted rate of \$30 and \$24 for a subsequent introductory membership. Introductory membership carries the same privileges as a full membership.

Pirst Family

The first family member to register for a full individual membership receives all privileges of a full U.S. Figure Skating membership. First family membership in a club is **\$60** yearly.

Subsequent

This membership option is available for related persons residing at the same address as a first family member. Subsequent family members can join at a reduced rate of **\$24** and enjoy the privileges of full membership.

Pour-year Collegiate

This four-year full membership is available to college-aged members at a reduced rate, and all skating privileges apply for the four-year duration. Collegiate members can purchase this membership through any club for \$70 or individually through U.S. Figure Skating for \$170. Each athlete may only use this option once during their skating career.
